I've been an artist since I could hold a pencil. That passion led me to study graphic design, launch my own creative agency, and ultimately return to what felt most true—expressing myself through art.

My work is rooted in joy, connection, and cultural memory. Whether on canvas or in digital form, I tell stories through Palometa the Pigeon, an iconic character who navigates the modern world with humor, resilience, and flair. From graffiti walls to gallery walls, I fuse street aesthetics with refined techniques, using vibrant color, layered textures, and pop culture to capture everyday moments with depth and playfulness.

Palometa has flown across borders—exhibited everywhere from Bogotá and Tokyo to Times Square. This show, Tropical Concrete, celebrates her journey from the heart of Cartagena to the pulse of New York City.




Artist Bio

Yuseph David Zapata Lamir—known professionally as YuZapata—is a Colombian artist whose practice bridges graphic design, street art, and immersive installation. A lifelong creative, he began drawing as a child and later founded his own creative agency before transitioning to a full-time art practice centered on storytelling through his character Palometa the Pigeon.

YuZapata's work has been exhibited globally, including in Bogotá, NYC, Tokyo, Miami, and Barcelona, across both digital and physical spaces. In 2024, his art was featured on screens in Times Square and in Bitbasel's The Future of Arts at Miami Art Week. His pieces merge social commentary, nostalgia, and cultural pride through graffiti-inspired palettes and streetwise symbolism.

Exhibition Overview

YuZapata: Tropical Concrete is a full-sensory journey into the universe of Palometa the Pigeon. With a bold fusion of vibrant tropical color, urban grit, and multimedia installations, the exhibition reimagines the streets of Cartagena within the framework of New York's concrete jungle.

The show transforms the gallery into a living, breathing ecosystem of sound, light, and spirit. Visitors will encounter LED-lit flight paths, neon-mirrored reflections, and an immersive Caribbean ambiance shaped by interactive art and movement-responsive design.

This is not just an exhibition—it's a celebration of hybridity, migration, and joyful resistance.






Exhibition Summary: YuZapata – Tropical Concrete

In Tropical Concrete, Colombian artist YuZapata transforms
Bushwick Gallery into a vibrant collision of Caribbean joy and New
York grit. Anchored by his signature character—Palometa the
Pigeon—this immersive solo exhibition blurs the line between
street and studio, nostalgia and now.

Featuring 16 works spanning spray-painted canvases, sculptural forms, digital animations, and framed urban objects, the show captures the visual rhythm of Cartagena and reinterprets it through the lens of pop culture, hip-hop, and global street art.

Neon lights, mirrored installations, and LED animations pulse with tropical color, turning the gallery into a multisensory flight path through identity, humor, resistance, and play.

YuZapata: Tropical Concrete is more than an exhibition—it's a celebration of hybrid identities, vibrant cultures, and the uncontainable energy of a pigeon who refuses to stay grounded.
